THE BILDNER CENTER FOR THE STUDY OF JEWISH LIFE STUDY IN ISRAEL AWARDS

Study in Israel Awards provide financial support for either undergraduate or graduate study or research at an accredited Israeli university (Hebrew University, Tel Aviv University, Bar-Ilan University, Ben-Gurion University, University of Haifa, and the Technion) and, in exceptional cases, for students doing independent research in Israel for a thesis or independent study. These awards are open to all Rutgers students pursuing any field of study. Consideration will be given only to applicants with documentation of their acceptance from an Israeli university or, where relevant, a research project proposal pre-approved by an appropriate faculty member. Students will need to comply with all current Rutgers University policies concerning study abroad. NOTE: If you receive needs-based financial aid, please be advised that receiving a Study in Israel Award may result in the reduction of federal student aid or loans.

Eligibility and Requirements: To be eligible for a Study in Israel award, the applicant must be currently enrolled as a full-time undergraduate or graduate student at Rutgers. Students must submit an application to be considered for these awards, all of which are based on academic merit. In addition to filing this application form, students should submit a copy of their unofficial Rutgers transcript, provide documentation of their acceptance for study at one of the above universities or faculty approval of their research project, and request two letters of recommendation from Rutgers faculty. Please request these letters at least two weeks before the deadline and ask professors to send their letters directly to Prof. Azzan Yadin-Israel by regular mail or email: azzan@rutgers.edu.

To be considered for an award, students must prepare the following:

- 1. Application form (see second page of this document)
- 2. Information about your proposed travel (see second page of this document)
- 3. An unofficial Rutgers transcript
- 4. Documentation of acceptance for study at one of the eligible universities or pre-approved research plan.
- 5. Two letters of recommendation from faculty. Please ask professors to send their letters by the due date directly to Professor Azzan Yadin-Israel by email (azzan@rutgers.edu) or regular mail (at the address below).
