APPLICATION INSTRUCTIONS FOR JEWISH STUDIES RESEARCH AWARDS FALL 2020

DEADLINE: NOVEMBER 16, 2020

Jewish Studies Research awards enable Rutgers undergraduate and graduate students to pursue Jewish Studies research, or take Jewish Studies courses at institutions other than Rutgers. In accordance with travel restrictions due to the Covid-19 pandemic, research must be completed remotely or on a digital platform. Students can take courses at another university if they are taken online. To be eligible for an award, undergraduate applicants must have completed at least one course in the Department of Jewish Studies at Rutgers; they need not be Jewish Studies majors or minors. Graduate students enrolled in MA or PhD programs who are conducting research on a topic in Jewish Studies may also apply. Preference will be given to students who have a sustained record of achievement in Jewish Studies. Prior recipients of awards from the Department of Jewish Studies may reapply.

All awards are based on academic merit; some awards are based on both academic merit and financial need. To be considered for awards based on both merit and need, students must have a FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) on file with the Rutgers Financial Aid Office. NOTE: If you receive needs-based financial aid, please be advised that receiving a Jewish Studies Student Award may result in the reduction of federal student aid or loans.

To be considered for an award, applicants must submit the following:

- 1. Application documents
- 2. An unofficial Rutgers transcript
- 3. Two letters of recommendation from faculty. Please request these letters at least two weeks before the deadline and ask professors to e-mail their letters directly to the Jewish Studies Department Administrator, Jenny Gehrmann (jennyg13@rutgers.edu).
